Carolyn & Kem Gardner Building

Fall 2018

The "New OSH", now know as the Carolyn and Kem Gardner building, will open for classes and research in the fall of 2018. This building will be the new home of the College of Social and Behavioral Science. It will also be the main classroom facility on campus, containing 33 classrooms and two auditoriums, as well as several meeting rooms, collaborative lab facilities, food service options, and places for students to gather and study.

One of the most exciting aspects of the new building will be its emphasis on sustainable design. The new Carolyn and Kem Gardner building will have features such as added insulation, Solarban 90 windows, light wells, solar panels, a rain harvesting system, a water conservation garden, geothermal heating, and more. Lori Kaczka, of the University's Facilities Management Department, believes that "the building will set the bar high for continued research of and for sustainability throughout campus and the Salt Lake Valley." The collaboration of research and teaching that will occur within this building will surely spark energy for integrative learning on campus, as well as promote sustainable initiatives on and off campus.
